1. Chairperson, Michele Stress, opened the meeting with introductions and gave the update for the Outreach Technical Workgroup (OTW):
 - -Marsha Cook is compiling a table of potential Integrated Pest Management (IPM) projects for FY03/04 \$38,000 allotted funds. Ideas are needed regarding effective IPM mobile displays.
 - Speakers Bureau is being considered to replace the regional workshops.
 - Movie theatre slides will begin to be shown in more theatres at the end of May
2. Participants discussed and refined definitions for a list of 15 watershed terms. (These terms and definitions can be found on www.projectcleanwater.org/html/tac_education.html by clicking on the “Message Board”).
3. Participants discussed both IPM and Watershed Awareness displays for residential outreach. Suggestions were offered to make displays more attractive and inter-active to increase outreach effectiveness.
4. Margarita Mogollón gave a presentation on Coastal Snapshot Day scheduled May 17, 2003. Erick Burres of the State Water Resources Control board offered additional information and fielded questions.
5. Roundtable:
 - Cecilia Lyon will be participating at the Coronado Flower Show the weekend of April 25-26.
 - The County of San Diego will participate at the Lakeside Rodeo, I Love A Clean Alpine and Earth Day at Balboa Park.

-The County's Watershed Protection Program is partnering with the Greater San Diego and the Mission Resource Conservation Districts on a Watershed Awareness poster contest through May for grades 7-12. Winners will be announced at the Clean Water Summit, June 20, 2003.

-Rita Spiegel offered that the students from the SEAL Program might be interested in presenting at the Clean Water Summit.

-Dr. Badri Badriyha of SDSU discussed the potential for SDSU to host a database for citizen watershed monitoring.

-Michele Stress mentioned that several funding sources are available for Watershed and Non-Point Source Pollution Control Programs. Concept Proposals are due May 9th. Erick Burres offered additional information on types of project sought, including citizen monitoring.

-Margarita distributed information on the City of San Diego Clean Water Taskforce Education Subcommittee's first event to kick-off new water-related curriculum: Project SWELL's Schoolyard Sleuths, May 2, 2003.
